USA Ninja Challenge is a fitness based program utilizing obstacle course equipment and a variety of programs which challenge a participant's skill and knowledge. Ninja Challenge is targeted towards to boys and girls ages 4 to 18. There are two franchise models offered within the Ninja Challenge franchise, one is a Full Gym franchise which is 4,000 to 6,000 square feet in size and a second franchise which is a conversion franchise model offered to gymnastics gyms already in business who wish to add the USA Ninja Challenge model to an existing gym operation.

The total investment necessary to begin operations of a Full Gym USA Ninja Challenge franchise is \$121,300 - \$186,600 This includes the \$30,000 franchise fee that must be paid to the franchisor or affiliate

The total investment necessary to begin operations of a In-Gym USA Ninja Challenge franchise is \$12,750 to \$41,500. This includes the \$6,000 to \$10,000 franchise fee, training fee or territory fee that must be paid to the franchisor or affiliate.
