We grant you the right to operate a VERLO<sup>®</sup> Mattress retail/assembly store (the "Retail/Assembly Store") or retail mattress service store (the "Retail Service Store."). At your Retail/Assembly Store or Retail Service Store, you will assemble and sell at retail VERLO<sup>®</sup> custom mattresses and box springs (the "Products") and certain accessory items for the Products (the "Accessories"). We may also grant you the right to operate up to 10 retail only ("Retail Showrooms") and/or additional Retail Service Stores in connection with your Retail/Assembly Store or initial Retail Service Store.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Retail/Assembly Store is from \$941,000 to \$1,400,300. This includes \$54,500 to \$57,800 that must be paid to us and our affiliates. The total initial investment necessary to begin operation of a Retail Service Store is from \$812,600 to \$1,198,600. This includes \$54,500 to \$57,800 that must be paid to us and our affiliates. The total initial investment necessary to begin operation of a Retail Showroom is from \$523,333 to \$921,667. This includes \$25,000 that must be paid to us and our affiliates. If you sign a multiple store development addendum, you will pay us a development fee of \$75,000 to \$300,000 depending on the number of Retail/Assembly Stores and/or Retail Service Stores you commit to develop.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.
