1 The California Franchise Investment law requires a copy of all proposed agreements relating to the sale of the franchise be delivered together with the offering circular

2 California Business and Professions Code 20000 through 20043 provides rights to the franchisee concerning termination or non-renewal of a franchise, if the franchise agreement contains a provision that is inconsistent with the law, the law will control

3 The franchise agreement provides for termination upon bankruptcy This provision may not be enforceable under federal bankruptcy law (11 U S C A Sec 101 et seq)

4 The franchise agreement contains a covenant not to compete which extends beyond the termination of the franchise This provision may not be enforceable under California law

5 The franchise agreement contains a liquidated damage clause Under California Civil Code Section 1671, certain liquidated damages clauses are unenforceable

6 Section 31125 of the California Corporations Code requires us to give you a disclosure document, in a form containing the information that the commissioner may by rule or order require, before a solicitation of a proposed material modification of an existing franchise

7 You may sign a general release if you renew or transfer your franchise California Corporations Code § 31512 voids a waiver of your rights under the Franchise Investment Law (California Corporations Code §§ 31000 through 31516) Business and Professions Code § 20010 voids a waiver of your rights under the Franchise Relations Acts (Business and Professions Code §§ 20000 through 2043)

The franchise business that you will own and operate is a retail purified water store under the name of WATERIA. A WATERIA store will sell drinking water and ice purified on the premises. It will also sell water dispensers and related accessories.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a WATERIA franchise is in the range of \$89,750 to \$121,700 [see Item 7]. This range includes the \$20,000 franchise fee that must be paid to us [see Item 5] and an initial rent/security deposit for the business location but does not include the rent over the life of the business location lease.

This Franchise Disclosure Document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this Franchise Disclosure Document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this Franchise Disclosure Document at least 14 calendar-days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no government agency has verified the information contained in this document.**
