The franchise is to operate a restaurant under the WING-STOP® trade name and business system that serves buffalo-style chicken wings and complementary side dishes and beverages.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a WING-STOP® Restaurant is \$238,377 to \$922,930, <u>excluding</u> real estate purchase and lease costs. This includes \$22,500 to \$30,000 that must be paid to the franchisor or affiliate. You sign the Development Agreement even if you want only one Restaurant franchise. If you want development rights for more than one Restaurant, you must pay the franchisor a development fee equal to \$10,000 times the number of Restaurants you commit to develop.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar-days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.

THE DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT AND FRANCHISE AGREEMENT REQUIRE YOU TO RESOLVE DISPUTES WITH US BY ARBITRATION OR LITIGATION ONLY IN CITY AND STATE WHERE WE HAVE OUR PRINCIPAL BUSINESS ADDRESS WHEN THE ACTION IS COMMENCED (IT CURRENTLY IS IN DALLAS, TEXAS). OUT-OF-STATE ARBITRATION OR LITIGATION MAY FORCE YOU TO ACCEPT A LESS FAVORABLE SETTLEMENT FOR DISPUTES. IT MAY ALSO COST YOU MORE TO ARBITRATE OR LITIGATE WITH US IN OUR HOME CITY AND STATE THAN IN YOUR OWN STATE.
- 2. THE DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT AND FRANCHISE AGREEMENT STATE THAT TEXAS LAW GOVERNS THE AGREEMENT, AND THIS LAW MAY NOT PROVIDE THE SAME PROTECTION AND BENEFITS AS LOCAL LAW. YOU MAY WANT TO COMPARE THESE LAWS.
